Monday Evening

Downtown Double Decker Tour - \$42 – Guide Provided

See New York when it sparkles! A 2 ½ hour tour on a double-decker bus, where you stop at the historic Brooklyn Fulton Ferry Landing for a photo opportunity and jaw dropping views of the glittering Manhattan Skyline. Enjoy nighttime views and ambiance of Times Square, Chinatown, Empire State Building, Greenwich Village, SoHo, Little Italy, Manhattan Bridge, Brooklyn Bridge and Lower East Side. Our licensed tour guides will narrate the history of all the famous sights of this magnificent city for your enjoyment and learning pleasure.

Little Italy/Chinatown/Staten Island Ferry - \$5 – Guide Provided

Walking beside the narrow, cobble stoned streets beneath the fire escapes of turn-of-the-century tenements; you're tempted by the sights, sounds and smells of Italian cuisine and culture emanating from the restaurants surrounding you at every step. A coal brick oven pizza...a zeppole...a cannoli...you'll find it all in New York City's Little Italy. Then take a 5 mile, 25 minute ride on the Staten Island Ferry which provides a majestic view of New York Harbor and a no-hassle boat ride! One guide book calls it "One of the world's greatest (and shortest) water voyages." From the ferries deck you will have a perfect view of The Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. You'll see the skyscrapers and bridges of Lower Manhattan receding as you pull away and coming into focus again as you return.

Phantom of the Opera - \$70

In The Phantom of the Opera, a young singer, Christine, is charmed by a mysterious specter who haunts the Paris Opera house. King and I - \$72

Set in the 1860s, *The King and I* is based on the true story of Anna Leonowens, a widowed schoolteacher from Wales who travels to Siam to teach the King's many children. Her effect on the kingdom and the kingdom's effect on her are the basis of this beautiful and classic musical.

Les Miserables - \$62

Based on Victor Hugo's classic novel, *Les Miserables* is an epic and uplifting story about the survival of the human spirit. The magnificent score of *Les Miserables* includes the classic songs "I Dreamed a Dream," "On My Own," "Stars," "Bring Him Home," "Do You Hear the People Sing?," "One Day More," "Empty Chairs at Empty Tables," "Master Of The House" and many more.

Fiddler on the Roof - \$72

Thursday

Times Square/Empire State Building - \$32 – Guide Provided

First stop Times Square for dinner and shopping. After sunset, we'll walk over to a truly amazing place. The Empire State Building's 86th floor observatory, 1,050 feet (320 meters), reached by high speed, automatic elevators, has both a glass-enclosed area, and spacious outdoor promenades on all four sides of the Building.

9/11 Memorial Museum - \$24 – Guide Provided

The National September 11 Museum is the principal museum commemorating the September 11 attacks of 2001 and the World Trade Center bombing of 1993. The Museum displays artifacts associated with the events of 9/11, while presenting stories of loss and recovery.

Chelsea Market and the Highline - \$5 – Guide Provided

Chelsea Market is an enclosed urban food court, shopping mall, office building and television production facility located in the Chelsea neighborhood of Manhattan. A guide of the top food eats will be provided. After dinner and shopping, you'll take a walk on The High Line. This linear park is a 1.45-mile-long park built in the Meatpacking District on an elevated section of a disused New York Central Railroad spur called the West Side Line. The view is amazing.
